Arrival in Germany – Information for Refugees

We are happy to welcome you to Jena. The city of Jena is here for you during this difficult time and will try to support you as best we can if you have any questions or problems. In a crisis situation, the city of Jena will take care of finding you new accommodation if you cannot stay where you have been privately housed. In such a case, write to **neu@jena.de**

Questions about residency status

You are initially free to stay in Germany for 90 days with no limitations. During these 90 days, you can move freely within Germany and take your time to consider where you would like to stay for the long term. After 90 days, you have to apply for a residence permit. However, we also strongly recommend that you register a place of residence.

The first steps after arrival

- **Open a bank account:**

You will need the registration certificate for your place of residence
[Meldebescheinigung] and your passport/ID card.

- In Jena there are currently no institutions which exchange Ukrainian currency for euros.

- A registration with a principal place of residence is a prerequisite for the disbursement of financial assistance. If you have registered, you can apply for benefits under the Asylum Seekers Benefits Act (Asylbewerberleistungsgesetz).
